

Harrisons to market De-Bug fuel treatment units

HARRISONS Trading (Sabah) Sdn Bhd, along with De-Bug Worldwide Ltd, announced in Kota Kinabalu yesterday the release of the fuel treatment units through Harrisons branches in Sabah.

De-Bug Worldwide Limited Managing Director Robin Darling said before the De-Bug, diesel fuel was treated with biocides (chemicals) as a bug-killer.

These toxic chemicals, which kill the bugs in fuel, are poisonous to other animals and plant life while also damaging the environment.

“The De-Bug fuel treatment units use environment-friendly magnetism to kill the bugs in the fuel while conditioning it making the fuel cleaner in burning and therefore improving the engine economy,” Darling said.

He said fuel and maintenance savings from two per cent to 10 per cent are common after fitting a De-Bug unit.

Stoppages caused by blocked filters would become a thing of the past, he added and that smoke emissions from exhausts are also minimized.

He also said several eminent laboratories including ICI (NZ) and RIVO (The Netherlands) have successfully tested the De-Bug.
